

The Benefits of Using a *Nurse Registry*

Nurse Registry vs. Home Health Agency:

A ***Nurse Registry*** and a *Home Health Agency* are both licensed by the State of Florida, *Agency for health Care Administration*. A ***Nurse Registry*** pays a higher fee than that of a Home Health Agency. The rules and regulations are available for review under the **AHCA** website, at ...**MyFlorida.com**. As the client, you have more say over what services the caregiver performs and may contact the caregiver personally. A Home Health Agency requires you communicate directly through the main office, where your wishes may not always be conveyed. Typically, out of 100% of the bill rate a Home Health Agency receives 60%, and the employee receives 40%. The ***Nurse Registry, Independent Contractor***, receives on average, 70% of the bill rate, and the ***Nurse Registry*** receives 30%.

Contractors vs. Employees:

A ***Nurse Registry*** has ***Independent Contractors***...a Home Health Agency has ***employees***. While under contract with *Senior Home Companions, Inc.* the ***Independent Contractors*** have chosen to handle their own taxes and insurance. This means a higher percentage of the bill rate goes directly to the contractor insuring better quality of care for the client. Caregivers who work for a ***Nurse Registry*** are typically AAA quality ... have years of private health care experience and have the knowledge base and communication skills to more than adequately meet your needs. The old saying "**You get what you pay for**" ... remains true.
